



KEY TRAVEL INFORMATION

If you travel to Poland by plane, the most convenient airports to reach Lodz are **Warsaw Chopin (WAW), Warsaw Modlin (WMI), and Lodz Władysław Reymont (LCJ)**. You can also fly to Wrocław, Krakow or Poznań – it takes around 3 hours to get to Lodz from each of these cities. Below you can find some additional information on how to reach Lodz city centre from the three nearest airports:

1. Lodz Airport (LCJ)

Located approximately 7 km from the city centre, Lodz Airport offers convenient access to all key points of interest in the city.

 **Public transport: bus lines 65A or 65B leave directly from outside the terminal building.** To reach the city centre (e.g. 'Piotrkowska Centrum' stop), you will need to transfer to a different bus or tram mid-way. The journey to the city centre **takes approx. 30' and costs around 1,5 €.**

 **Taxi:** you can take a taxi from outside the terminal building. Most app-based taxi services such as Freenow, Bolt and Uber operate in Lodz- a ride to the city centre **costs around 10 €.**

2. Warsaw Chopin Airport (WAW)

Warsaw Chopin is Poland's largest airport, offering frequent international flights. **It typically takes around 2 hours to reach Lodz city centre from the airport by train.** This involves a transfer at Warszawa Zachodnia (Warsaw West) station.

 **Bus & train connection:** there is a direct bus connection from Warsaw airport to Lodz run by [FlixBus](#). If you opt to travel by train instead, a typical route is:

Warszawa Lotnisko Chopina (Chopin Airport) → **Warszawa Zachodnia** (Warsaw West) → **Łódź Fabryczna** (or Łódź Kaliska)

Step I: Chopin Airport → Warsaw West (approx. 15 mins)

This part of the journey is served by frequent regional SKM or Koleje Mazowieckie (KM) trains. SKM tickets can be bought at ticket machines on board the train while KM tickets can be purchased at the airport or [online](#).





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Step II: Warsaw West → Łódź Fabryczna

Trains to Łódź (typically Intercity or TLK services) run regularly and take up to 90 minutes. Tickets can be bought [online](#) (ticket sales may not open until closer to the travel date).

👉 To plan your journey, you can use the national rail [journey planner](#) (enter station names in Polish: e.g. “Warszawa Lotnisko Chopina” and “Łódź Fabryczna”).

👉 **Bus connection:** there is a direct bus connection from Modlin Airport to Łódź run by [FlixBus](#).

👉 **Train connection:** a shuttle bus connects the airport to Modlin Railway Station every 20–30 minutes, with a travel time of about 10 minutes. From Modlin Station, take a train to Warszawa Zachodnia (Warsaw West), then transfer to a train bound for Łódź Fabryczna. Train tickets can be purchased at the station or online via [Koleje Mazowieckie](#) and [PKP Intercity](#).

PUBLIC TRANSPORT IN LODZ

In Lodz, MPK is the provider of bus and tram transport services. **Tickets can be bought at a ticket machine on every bus and tram** - if you opt for a paper ticket, remember to validate it in the orange ticket machine.

Alternatively, it is also possible to purchase tickets via one of the online apps, such as [zbiletem.pl](#).

👉 You can use the same ticket on more than one bus or tram as long as it has not expired.

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ACCOMMODATION

There are many good quality and affordable accommodation options in Łódź. Some of the places we can recommend include:

 **Cotton House** (apartment-style rooms, located very close to the campus)

 **Hampton by Hilton Lodz City Center hotel** (3-star hotel, very centrally located, 15 min walk to the campus)

 **Qubus Hotel** (3-star hotel, 10 min walk to the campus)

 **Holiday Inn Łódź by IHG** (4-star hotel, 15 min walk to the campus)

 **Platon Residence Apartments** (affordable apartment-style rooms, located very close to the campus).

TUL CAMPUS

Lodz University of Technology (TUL) boasts a unique 37-hectare campus in the heart of the city which combines modern pavilions with revitalized post-industrial buildings. The campus is divided into several zones (including Campus A and B), offering a wide range of facilities including a sports centre, historic villas and a picturesque park .

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WHAT TO SEE IN LODZ

Łódź is a city full of fascinating contrasts, where industrial landmarks blend seamlessly with vibrant creativity. The city's rich heritage is shaped by four cultures - Polish, German, Jewish, and Russian, whose lasting influence can still be seen throughout Łódź today.

Key highlights include:

 **Manufaktura** – a stunning former textile factory turned into a cultural and shopping hub.

 **Museum of the Factory** – located inside Manufaktura, it presents the story of Łódź's textile industry and its people.

 **Piotrkowska Street** – the city's main artery, buzzing with cafes, shops, restaurants and historic architecture.

 **OFF Piotrkowska** – creative courtyard full of independent cafes, studios, and nightlife.

 **Księży Młyn** – a beautifully preserved 19th-century industrial complex with workers' housing.

 **EC1 Łódź** – a cutting-edge science and cultural centre in a former power plant.

 **Monopolis** – a revitalised industrial complex now hosting offices, dining venues, and cultural events.

 **Murals** – the [Łódź Street Art Trail](#) is worth following; it's what gives the city its open-air gallery feel.
